

LCCMR Co-Chair Agreement on Principles for the 2023 RFP Process
June 13, 2022

- The Co-chairs have a shared desire to develop a recommendation to the legislature based on LCCMR's collective evaluation of merit.
- The Co-chairs will not let Mason's and parliamentary procedure impede the process of the commission coming to consensus.
- The Co-chairs will make a strong recommendation that the legislature does not add projects to the ENRTF bill that did not apply to and get heard by the LCCMR.
- The commission will collectively choose on 6/27/22 what the evaluation & decision-making process will be for the 2023 RFP. The Co-chairs agree to uphold that decision on how the decision-making process will happen (in other words, as a hypothetic example: if the commission agrees on 6/27/22 that members will talk through each proposal one by one on allocation day to determine the amount of funding to recommend, then the chair on allocation day will not entertain a motion to bypass that process).
